FOOD PANTRY UPDATES AND IMPORTANT DATES: The Food Pantry of Galena, Hudson, Kankakee & Wills Township thanks you for your continued support of our local food pantry located at the United Methodist Church in Rolling Prairie. In addition to providing food for sustenance, we offer job postings, nutrition facts, library access, and a kind word of support. We have approximately 125 clients and as of June 21, 2018 those clients visited the pantry 488 times. Each client family can visit twice per month. The cost of food provided is \$30.00 for a small family and \$34.00 for a large family. Fundraising is important! Here are our upcoming fundraisers: July 21st and September 1st - Dollars for Dogs and Bake Sale at Kabelin's on the west side of La Porte; August 4th - Port-A-Pit Picnic at United Methodist Church – Pork Chops or Chicken – \$9.00; September 29th – 5K/8K Run beginning at 7:30 AM – St. John Kanty Church parking lot to Saugany Lake and back to St. John Kanty. Thank you for your continued support. The Pantry is open each Thursday 8:00 AM – 12:00 PM.

ST. JOHN KANTY ROSARY SODALITY OVERVIEW (PART 2):

What does the Rosary Sodality do for the Church?

- Donates financially to the Faith Formation program
- Purchases items for the altar at the request of the pastor
- Serves the funeral dinners
- Coordinates the baby Bottle Collection for the Women's Care Center annually
- Provides prizes and runs Bingo at the Golden Living Nursing Home in July
- Purchases gifts for the First Communicants
- Sponsors boys from the Sacred Heart Apostolate School to run in the local food pantry's 5K fundraiser
- Coordinates the Giving Tree at Christmas
- Buys Christmas baskets full of goodies for residents at Hamilton Grove (typically three residents)
- Donates coats, gloves, and belts to Rolling Prairie Elementary for students in need
- Organizes and maintains the church Prayer Line
- Holds freewill monetary collection at each meeting to donate to Sacred Heart Church's Food pantry in La Porte
- Collects and delivers the food donated by our parishioners to our local food pantry in Rolling Prairie

What fundraisers is the Rosary Sodality responsible for?

- Spring Card Party
- Bake Sales (as needed – rarely more than twice a year)
- Members enjoy a Christmas party with dinner at a restaurant.
- Membership dues
